#### Mi'kmaq History Month



October 1 is Treaty Day and marks the beginning of Mi'kmaw History Month in Nova Scotia. Throughout the year, and especially in October, teachers incorporate a variety of educational activities in their classroom instruction to highlight the connection of our past to today and how this information shapes our understanding of our shared history. In addition, schools organize activities to enhance Treaty Education.

Treaty Day and Mi'kmaw History Month is an opportunity for each of us to reflect on our own understanding of the important history, culture, contributions, achievements and traditions of the Mi'kmaw community.

The theme of Mi'kmaw History Month 2023 is Mi'kmaw Sports, Traditional Games and Pastimes. As the poster shares, for generations, participation in sports and games have grown Mi'kmaw ways of knowing and being, teaching young ones how to hear, how to see, and how to move. Competition sharpens skills and builds endurance, speed and strength. Sports demand young ones predict what will happen before it has actually occurred. Using this kind of pattern recognition together with all of our senses makes great hunters and skilled warriors. These teachings carry us into ways of thinking, moving and being as adults.

# Strait Regional Centre for Education Safe Arrival Process for Elementary Schools



Felix Marchand Education Centre and the Strait
Regional Centre for Education believe that regular
attendance at school supports greater student success
and achievement. Attendance supports student learning
and promotes a sense of responsibility that students
will need as they transition from grade to grade.
Promoting and supporting regular student attendance is
a shared responsibility. All partners, students,
parents/guardians, teachers, school administration and
school board staff, must work together.

As a result, the following safe arrival process will be implemented at our school to help us account for any student's unexplained failure to arrive at school:

- Parents/guardians are responsible for notifying the school when their child(ren) will not be in attendance.
- If your child(ren) is going to be late or absent from school, the parent/guardian is asked to contact the school by email **fmec.office@srce.ca** or telephone at (902) 345-2560 before 9:30 a.m. An explanation is required.

- On a daily basis, homeroom teachers will complete morning attendance. A list of those students who are absent will be generated.
- If a student is marked absent during first class and we have not been previously notified by parents/guardians, we will call the numbers provided in the student demographic information.
- When direct follow-up contact with parents/guardians cannot be reasonably made, we will then determine appropriate action. This may involve contact with the RCMP.
